Shofar Article: Why Keep Kosher? Jewish people often wonder why they should keep Kosher. What does God have against shellfish or bacon? In Judaism, there are two types of laws Mishpatim and Chukim. Mishpatim are the mitzvoth that are sensible and have rationale explanations. For example in Exodus 20 God declares; "Do not murder", "Do not steal." Whereas Chukim are the laws that seem to have no logical explanation; "You shall not wear a garment made with both linen and wool", "You shall not mix meat and milk." It's these Chukim that Jews often struggle to understand.

The Orthodox scholar Yeshayahu
Leibowitz proposed a very simple
solution to the quandary of the
Chukim. Leibowitz contended that
God is omnipotent and omniscient
and therefore the Chukim are beyond
mankind's understanding. So if God
writes in the Torah that you shall not eat
pig or lobster, we mortals have no right
to challenge his authority. However,
many Jews find Leibowitz's assertion
simplistic and unappealing and yearn
for a deeper understanding of why
Kashrut matters in the modern world.

I've always argued that keeping kosher requires continuous discipline. In life, we can find almost no action as natural or regularly occurring as

eating. That's why many of us fail to give much thought to our diet until our doctor tells us that we need to lower our cholesterol. Jews who keep kosher must make daily decisions on what they eat, when they eat it and how they prepare their food. The laws of kashrut force us to take one of the most instinctive activities and try to imbue it with holiness. The dietary laws compel us to stop and think about our daily activities so that we don't go through life on auto-pilot. Personally, I find that keeping kosher is a form of selfdiscipline that is crucial to successful living.

There is also a great deal of symbolism in the laws of kashrut. The famous command found in the Torah is "Do not cook a kid in its mother's milk." But why? Why did God forbid the Cheeseburger? I believe that the prohibition against eating milk and meat together reminds us of where our food originates. We remember that eating meat requires death, while acquiring milk requires life. As Rabbi Bucher writes, "These are foods that have their origin in living creatures and keeping them separate makes us aware of their source." By not eating milk and meat together we avoid the symbolic taboo of mixing life and death.

Even the types of animals we eat are chosen for their symbolic nature. The Torah specifies that a kosher animal must have split hooves. We know that animals with split hooves tend to be peaceful, domesticated animals. The Rabbis in the Talmud claim that these are the types of characteristics that we should be absorbing through our daily meals. Conversely, the Torah prohibits, eating scavengers and birds of prey, the characteristics that we should strive to avoid.

In the end, Kashrut like many other Chukim are not easily understood. For some it's enough that God commanded us to keep kosher. Others see the value in self-discipline that a halachik lifestyle requires. Perhaps, some Jews find meaning in the symbolic nature of the dietary laws. Finally, there are many in our congregation who choose not to observe a lifestyle whose roots are not based in logic.

What I hope we can all agree on is the importance of respecting the kashrut standards that have been established for the AAC kitchen. AAC bylaws state that only hechshered food products may be brought inside our kitchen and social hall and that only our approved caterers are authorized to prepare congregational meals. I have faith that we will all see the value in maintaining the highest standards within our kitchen thus preserving the sacred rite of Kashrut within our congregation.

Sunday School ended with a celebration of Shavu'ot. What is Shavu'ot, you say? I can honestly tell you that after 8 years of involvement with the AJCS school, I had no idea. The reason: The festival generally falls after the end of class sessions.

We learned: * that for the period between Passover and Shavu'ot, we count the OMER, 49 days or 7 full weeks; *that the word Shavu'ot means "weeks."; *that we count to remind us of our freedom from physical bondage until our spiritual redemption when we received the Torah at Mount Sinai; *that there are two new moons between Passover and Shavu'ot: *that work is not permitted during the festival days; *that it is customary to stay up on the first night of Shavu'ot and study Torah. *We learned that we also eat at least one dairy meal. For the Sunday School students, it meant ice cream and cheese blintzes made by the 4th/5th grade class with their teacher Leeann Port to celebrate the last day of classes.

As we neared the end of our year, the older classes engaged in a Mitzvah project. They volunteered at the Humane Society. Several of our students were experienced volunteers having selected the organization

for their Bat Mitzvah projects. The students cleaned and worked hard, but also received some well deserved appreciation from the pets. Our younger students stayed back at home base, and learned the joy of planting beautiful flowers with Dana. Water, soil, sun and SKY, fits right?

This year Rabbi Audrey and Rabbi Wohl worked with our Confirmation students to prepare them for their role in our Jewish community. They also brought the students together each morning for an informative and topical assembly. I can't begin to describe the wealth and depth of knowledge these spiritual leaders possess. And if you know our classes, their patience may also be one of their biggest virtues.

This congregation has given me so much by allowing me work with the Sunday School.
